

2. EGSIEM.EU

The EGSIEM project website was made available to the general public on the 20. March 2015. Its main purpose is to act as a dissemination instrument for project information, and as a document repository for those products which the consortium is able to offer, it also acts as an internal information exchange.

3. Technical Data

The site is located at http://egsiem.eu and has been registered with a number of search sites such as Google, Yahoo, Bing etc. To ensure that usage statistics are available we have also registered the site with Google Analytics and will be able to provide statistical feedback on how the site is used at various points in the future.

The site has been developed using the Joomla™ Content Management System (Version 3.4). The domain name (egsiem.eu) is registered at united-domains.com since it is a eu domain name. The site itself is hosted in Switzerland by metanet.ch. Further revisions to the website will be expected as more content from the project comes online.

4.Usage

The site is intended to be used by all members of the consortium, therefore we have given access to the 'non-static' parts of the site to EGSIEM collaborators via individual log-ins. This allows them to upload documentation such as Deliverables, Contact lists and other working documents (and News items) without recourse to the site administrators. To ensure a streamlined approach to site management, descriptor pages such as Consortium Membership and the project overview have been designated as 'static' and only site administrators can access these areas. However, these pages where developed with input from the whole consortium back in January-February 2015.

Although most of the site maintenance is undertaken by UBERN, the individual login approach ensures redundancy and has the advantage of giving the consortium its own internal area where items such as contact lists and internal guidance documentation can be shared. There is also the opportunity to comment on various items which we will explore over the next few months. The site also has links to the various social media channels which have been developed by the consortium, these are updated by various members of EGSIEM, with two individuals acting as editors, please see *Deliverable 1.1: Management Guidelines* for more information.
